

The Master – The Masters – The Master's

The Master: **Singular** (there is only one Master).

Example: The **Master** is very kind.

The Masters: **Plural** (there are two or more Masters).

Example: The **Masters** are all arriving today.

The Master's: **Possessive** (something belongs to the Master)

Example: The pupils follow the **Master's** instructions.

★

Examples



Noun: Book

- Singular: The **book** is on the shelf.
- Plural: The **books** are stacked on the desk.
- Possessive: The **book's** cover is torn.



Noun: Flower

- Singular: The **flower** is blooming in the garden.
- Plural: The **flowers** are colorful and fragrant.
- Possessive: The **flower's** petals are delicate.



Noun: Cat

- Singular: The **cat** is sleeping on the couch.
- Plural: The **cats** are playing in the garden.
- Possessive: The **cat's** toy is under the table.



Noun: Teacher

- Singular: The **teacher** is explaining the lesson.
- Plural: The **teachers** are meeting in the conference room.
- Possessive: The **teacher's** desk is organized.

Possessive apostrophe "s" ('s)

When to use the possessive ('s)?

- **Singular Nouns:** For most singular nouns, add an apostrophe followed by "s" to show possession.
 - Example: The dog's leash (the leash of the dog).
- **Plural Nouns Ending in "s":** For plural nouns that already end in "s," simply add an apostrophe after the "s."
 - Example: The dogs' park (the park of the dogs).
- **Plural Nouns Not Ending in "s":** For plural nouns that do not end in "s," add an apostrophe followed by "s."
 - Example: The children's playground (the playground of the children).

★

Examples

- The dog's leash (the leash of the dog).
- The children's toys are in the box (the toys of the children).
- The teacher's book is on the table (the book of the teacher).
- The dogs' park is very big (the park of the dogs).
- The girl's dress is beautiful (the dress of the girl).
- The students' homework is due tomorrow (the homework of the students).
- The friend's car is parked outside (the car of my friend).
- The boys' games are on the shelf (the games of the boys).
- The parents' house is painted blue (the house of my parents).
- The children's cookies are delicious (the cookies of the children).
